When we invest in disability, entire communities in Southwest Michigan benefit. In our 2016-2017 Annual Report you will read how our services impacted upon nearly 8,000 customers across eight counties. Included in this total is a very noticeable increase in our services supporting youth with disabilities transitioning from school to be better prepared for accomplishing their next goals of employment or post-secondary education. In a collaborative effort with schools and vocational rehabilitation, Disability Network provided a variety of pre-employment transition services that have potential to eliminate barriers and prepare students with disabilities to lead full and exciting lives. Many of our customer stories were focused on successes realized by youth with disabilities through skills learned to support self-sufficiency, including employer expectations, life engagement skills, financial literacy and budget training.



Opportunities for people with disabilities to access employment, independent living, affordable/accessible housing, healthcare, long term community services, benefits planning and transportation are common themes of the work we do. The services provided through our staff interactions with customers resulted in an impact upon the elimination of barriers to fully accessible and inclusive communities, where opportunities for full participation are becoming more prevalent. Additionally, through our educational endeavors, we strive for all community members to understand disability as part of the human experience; we provided workshops on disability pride, ableism and employment disclosure in promoting equality and full participation for all.

To ensure our valued services can continue to be realized for more people with disabilities, we will continue to invest in disability and relationships with Legislators, state and local partners, funders and donors in the years to come.
