Presentation & Workshop Offerings

→ Ableism 101

Examine disability discrimination on a systemic level by looking at the ways our society designs physically and socially segregated systems. Explore how language can be a key component to perpetuating stigma or supporting equality.

→ Assistance Animals: Do's & Don'ts

Learn the difference between service animals & emotional support animals and specific laws regarding each.

→ Disability & Employment: How, When & Why to Talk About It

Learn more about when an employee must disclose a disability or medical condition, requests for job accommodations, and what the employment laws are under the ADA. *(Note: This presentation can be geared toward employees with disabilities or toward management and human resource professionals.)*

→ Disability History & Culture
